This agreement allows Teton County Public Health to use a START bus as a mobile vaccine clinic. The County will pay the operational costs, such as minor maintenance and fuel. Public Health will be able to use the bus through Fall. Seats will be removed to allow more space to conduct the vaccine clinic.
