

**OFFICIAL SUMMARY PROCEEDINGS
OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, TETON COUNTY, WYOMING**

The Teton County Board of Commissioners met in regular meeting on **July 06, 2021** in the Commissioners Chambers located at 200 S. Willow in Jackson. The meeting was called to order at 9:02 a.m. and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

ROLL CALL

County Commission: Natalia Macker, Chairwoman, Luther Propst, Vice-Chairman, Mark Barron, and Greg Epstein were present. Mark Newcomb was absent.

MATTERS FROM COMMISSION AND STAFF

6. Consideration of Wilson Boat Ramp Contract Amendment for Design/Engineering Services

Steve Ashworth, Parks and Recreation Director, presented to the Board for consideration of approval a proposal and contract amendment with Harmony Design and Engineering to update designs and complete construction documents for the Wilson Boat Ramp development project.

Harmony Design and Engineering was contracted by Teton County to develop site designs for the Wilson Boat Ramp associated with the original conditional use permit. Upon receipt of the permit, they developed construction document for the project and facilitated the bidding of the project. Due to lack of appropriate funding, the project did not move forward. Since the original project solicitation several factors have changed that will be reflected in the project update. Most notable of these are the inclusion of future wildlife crossings and the HWY22 road realignment.

Public comment was given by Jared Baecker and Bud Chatham.

A motion was made by Commissioner Propst and seconded by Commissioner Epstein to approve the amendment to the contract agreement with Harmony Design and Engineering to add \$13,890 to complete design and construction document updates for the Wilson Boat Ramp development project. Chairwoman Macker called for a vote. The vote showed all in favor and the motion carried.

17. Consideration of County Fire Restrictions

Brady Hansen, Fire Chief/Fire Warden, presented to the Board for consideration of approval a request that Teton County implement Partial Fire Closure for unincorporated areas of Teton County prohibiting open fires.

Teton County Fire Warden Brady Hansen has identified all the risk factors are now exceeded to implement open burning restrictions:

- Bridger Teton Forest was declared to be in "Very High" fire danger on June 21, 2021

- Local resources have been drawn down to preparedness level 4 due to other fires outside of our area
- We are starting to see local fire starts that are human caused
- Bridger Teton Forest implemented fire restrictions July 1st
- The long-term forecast is for more hot/dry weather

There was no public comment.

A motion was made by Commissioner Epstein and seconded by Commissioner Propst to approve the resolution implementing partial fire closure for the unincorporated area of Teton County prohibiting open fires. Chairwoman Macker called for a vote. The vote showed all in favor and the motion carried.

31. Consideration to Purchase SPET Funded Wildland Fire Apparatus

Brady Hansen, Fire Chief, presented to the Board for consideration of approval the purchase of four (4) fire apparatus (engines).

Jackson Hole Fire/EMS has partnered with Wyoming State Forestry for over 30 years to acquire "retired" wildland fire apparatus through an excess equipment program. Today's needs have surpassed the technological and performance standards this aged apparatus can offer. As a result, Jackson Hole Fire/EMS seeks to purchase four new engines on the open market. Many needs can be addressed through this purchase. Jackson Hole Fire/EMS then pursued a formal bid process to purchase four (4) custom-built engines. Due in part to the supply chain crisis, only one bid was received, and it requires a 450–500-day build time for each engine. Given the desire to have an engine or engines in place significantly sooner, staff researched alternative options and were able to locate a single demo engine that, while not custom-built, can be delivered immediately and placed into service while the custom engines are built.

There was no public comment.

A motion was made by Commissioner Barron and seconded by Commissioner Epstein to approve the contract with Frontrange Fire Apparatus for three custom-built engines, in the amount of \$1,344,054.00, and to approve the contract with Boise Mobile Equipment for 1 demo engine, in the amount of \$365,000.00. Chairwoman Macker called for a vote. The vote showed all in favor and the motion carried.

32. Consideration of Agreement with Teton county, Idaho Fire Protection District for Alta, Wyoming Fire/EMS Service

Keith Gingery, Deputy County Attorney, presented to the Board for consideration of approval a contract with Teton County, Idaho Fire Protection District to provide Fire/EMS service for Alta, Wyoming.

Teton County, Wyoming currently contracts with the Teton County, Idaho Fire Protection District to provide Fire/EMS service to the Alta, Wyoming area. The current agreement was entered into in 2016 and expires September 30, 2021. The 2016 agreement provided for a \$200,000.00 per year payment. The Teton County, Idaho Fire Protection District sent a letter on May 3, 2021 and then followed up with a direct meeting with the Teton County, Wyoming Board of County Commissioners to discuss changes to the proposed 2021-2026 agreement. 1/8 of the call volume for the Fire Protection District comes from Wyoming, with the majority of those calls being ambulance calls to the Grand Targhee Resort. It is expected that calls will increase to Grand Targhee Resort as the residential development of the resort begins.

Brady Hansen, Fire Chief, answered questions from the Board.

There was no public comment.

A motion was made by Commissioner Epstein and seconded by Commissioner Propst to approve the Wyoming Fire Protection, Emergency Medical Services, and Ambulance Services Contract with the Teton County, Idaho Fire Protection District. Chairwoman Macker called for a vote. The vote showed all in favor and the motion carried.

33. Consideration of Resolution Finding a Need for Additional Land for a New Fire Station in Teton Village

Keith Gingery, Deputy County Attorney, presented to the Board for consideration of approval a Resolution finding a need for additional land for a new fire station in Teton Village, Wyoming.

Public comment was given by Nicole Krieger.

A motion was made by Commissioner Barron and seconded by Commissioner Epstein to indefinitely postpone this item. Chairwoman Macker called for a vote. The vote showed all in favor and the motion carried.

34. Consideration of Approval of Case Management Software Contract

A motion was made by Commissioner Barron and seconded by Commissioner Epstein to continue this item to the July 20, 2021 BCC Meeting. Chairwoman Macker called for a vote. The vote showed all in favor and the motion carried.

The meeting recessed at 10:15 a.m. and reconvened at 10:27 a.m.

A motion was made by Commissioner Barron and seconded by Commissioner Epstein to approve SD2021-0002, dated May 17, 2021 for the partial vacation and re-plat of a building envelope on Lot 23 of the Altamont Subdivision, being able to make the four (4) findings of Section 8.5.3. and the standards of Section 8.2.13.C., being able to make the finding pursuant to Wyoming Statute §34-12-108, that such partial vacation does not abridge or destroy any of the rights and privileges of other proprietors in Plat No. 852, with no conditions, and request the Teton County Clerk to write vacate on Lot 23 of Plat No. 852 upon the filing of a new plat. Chairwoman Macker called for a vote. The vote showed all in favor and the motion carried.
