



Teton LEPC Meeting Minutes

March 21, 2019

- I. **Call to Order** – Rich Ochs called the meeting to order at 0830.
- II. **Around the Room Introductions** – Went around the room and everyone introduced themselves.
- III. **Approval of January LEPC Meeting Minutes** – Tom Ninnemann made a motion to approve the January LEPC minutes, Battalion Chief Coe seconded. All approved.
- IV. **Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan Update** - Ryan Carroll presented the Wyoming Region 8 Hazard Mitigation plan update and reviewed the webpage. Continue to get the word out. Received 225 responses on the survey. Reviewed the highest concerns from the community and Risk Assessment Overview. We'll look into the risk and vulnerability section next month. The Town of Jackson, Teton County and Teton Conservation District are the three signers on this plan. Reviewed the schedule for the next few months.
- V. **Citizen Corps Council / CERT Update** – Jenny Kruger has 73 current members, volunteers logged 400 hours, it cost just over \$4,000. Have a new class starting April 13th – 15th.
- VI. **2018 Tier II Report Update** - Rich Ochs reviewed the Tier II Report which tracks hazardous material in Teton County. Waiting to get the final list. Reviewed the preliminary list from the state list. Every fire department receives every Tier II report for their jurisdiction. All the local facilities are reporting which is between 40-45 that report. Reviewed the map of the facilities. Reviewed the extremely hazardous materials in Teton County.
- VII. **Airport Tabletop Exercise / TEP Updates** - Dustin Havel - Tabletop exercise will be April 10th from 11 – 1, lunch will be provided. The guest speaker this year works

with Delta Airlines and deals with emergency situations. The scenario is based on a 757 catching on fire while being fueled. This scenario will lead up to a full-sized scenario next year. Steve Markason announced a big fire cooperater meeting. Mike Johnson will get an email out. It will be sometime in May.

VIII. **Around the Room** - EOC - 2019 grant program is open and is due by April 18th. Any taxing entity can apply. Another grant opportunity is the non-profit security application. There is a web seminar today at noon. Just got back from the flood summit in Riverton. Reviewed the local rivers. If we have above average temperatures and rain it may cause issues. The State Operations Center is changing their name to the SRCC. Homeland security has two section chief openings. CERT class in April. Public Works is opening the storm drains and has removed a lot a snow. They will be getting the sweepers out soon. There were some new issues with the Verizon tower on the parking garage. Should see better service on top of Snow King. Forest Service – The Firewise Wildlife Coalition is kicking off a meeting tonight. Starting to on board permanent firefighters this month. There will be prescribed burn west of Redtop Meadows. Teton County IT – GARN repeater is back up. Fire/EMS is having a lot of static issues. There was a large power leak next to Station 1. The RFI is in for the new radio system. Jackson Police is ready for the Hill Climb madness. There will be more parking on Snow King and Karnes. SAR – Rendezvous Fest went well and the IAP is still working. Media - The news studio will be moving near the SAR hanger. Working on accessing on air via computer. Teton County Commissioners will out for the next two weeks and then will be reviewing budgets. Hazmat team has deployed some new equipment that can analyze a liquid. Will be putting in for a new device called RAMAN that will tell us about powders. Have six members going to TEEEX for confined space rescue training. Fire/EMS is continuing with WUI field trips to look at different WUI areas and become familiar. Trying to get more funding for the stop the bleed kits for the schools. Roof snow slides are crushing natural gas feed. There have been a lot of calls. Continue to have several overlapping 911 calls. Met with Teton County Idaho yesterday trying to improve relations. Sheriff has two message boards and a horse trailer they will be digging out. Airport - Will be a very busy summer, the temporary schedule is in. Peak times are still tight. Look into pre-check. Remember if you see something say something. Active shooter is one of the top threats. Doing more construction on access road work and parking lot improvements. Will have 150 more parking spaces. Also doing a few modifications in the terminal area. Finished the fuel farm and rental car area.
