

## COVID-19 Resources and Health Order Updates – December 18, 2020



- 1) In the past two weeks (12/3 to 12/16), there were 274 new cases reported. This is down 34% from the previous two-week period.
  - 115 cases attributable to community spread (42%)
  - 148 cases had close contact with another known case (54%)
  - 26 cases had a history of travel (9.5%) – May be included in other 2 categories
- 2) As of 12/17/2020, we have 90 known active cases. Statistics overview can be found [here](#).
- 3) **Health Orders and Recommendations:**
  - The 18<sup>th</sup> continuation of Order #1, #2, and #3 are active from December 9<sup>th</sup> through January 8<sup>th</sup>. Click [here](#) to view the orders and **read the [summary of changes](#)** to know exactly what has been changed to the Statewide Health Orders.
  - [New Statewide Face Covering Order](#) requiring individuals to wear masks throughout the State of Wyoming, including State and County Buildings. Active from December 9<sup>th</sup> through January 8<sup>th</sup>.
  - [Face Covering Order for Teton County](#) (active December 1<sup>st</sup> through January 4<sup>th</sup>)
    - People must wear a mask in any business, not just in retail or commercial settings. A business is defined as any type of business entity (including non-profits) that employ or engage workers or volunteers. This includes office spaces and back of the house at restaurants where the public does not normally enter.

- 7) Please be aware, according to the CDC current guidelines, individuals who test positive but have been identified as a close contact will not be asked to quarantine if 1.) their past positive result was within a 90-day period and 2.) they have no symptoms. Because they have a new known exposure, we encourage symptom monitoring as reinfection can occur. In this 90-day period after testing positive, testing in the absence of symptoms is not recommended.
- 8) Please share the following messages with your employees:  
If employees want their workplace business to stay open, they should do the following:
  - Limit their social activities outside of work. We are seeing transmission from co-worker to co-worker outside of work hours and employees exposing themselves outside of work with friends and then later exposing co-workers.
  - Communicate with supervisor- if they suspect they are a close contact, symptomatic and or test positive. Employees will not get in trouble if they test positive or are determined a close contact. The more open communication between staff and supervisors, the better!
