

COVID-19 Resources and Health Order Updates – May 28, 2021

1) We remain in the Green (New Normal) Risk Level. Let's keep us there!

2) **Updated Statistics:**

- Between May 14, 2021 and May 27, 2021 Teton County detected 17 new cases. This is a 41% decrease from the previous two-week period.
- 1.24% of COVID-19 tests in the past two weeks were positive.
- 59% of cases in the past two weeks have been due to community spread.
- As of 5/27/2021, there were 9 known active cases in Teton County.



3) **Health Orders and Recommendations:**

- **Statewide Health Orders**
 - The [27th Continuation of Order #1](#) stating conditions of operation for establishments including childcare facilities, K-12 schools, colleges, universities, and trade schools has been amended as of May 21, 2021 and goes through May 31, 2021.
 - The [27th Continuation of Order #2](#) stating gathering size limitations has been revoked as of May 21, 2021.
- **Face Covering Order/Mask Updates**
 - [Public Health Order #21-4](#) requires face coverings in K-12 schools throughout Teton County, WY from June 1, 2021 through June 11, 2021.
 - Teton County Health Department recommends community members to continue to follow the [CDC's guidance for mask usage](#).
 - **Local businesses, organizations, and event planners may develop their own policies for their staff and customers, as long as accommodations can be made for those requiring exemptions.**
 - Here are a few reasons why you may want to consider continuing to have a mask policy at your establishment or event:
 - You may have staff that are still not fully vaccinated or have underlying medical conditions.
 - Since you cannot ask customers if they are vaccinated, you may choose to continue to have a mask policy to protect your staff and patrons until a larger percentage of the US population has received their vaccine.
 - Children under the age of 12 are not eligible to receive a vaccine yet.
 - Infection after vaccination, though rare and often significantly less severe, **can** happen.
 - [Resolution for Mask Order at Certain County Buildings](#) including the Teton County Health Department, the Emergency Management Center, the Hansen Courthouse and the County Courthouse is valid through June 30, 2021.
 - [Federal Mask Mandate](#) for federal buildings and federal lands.

5) Testing Update and Resources:

- **WHEN TO TEST?**
 - If you have symptoms (vaccinated or not) – test immediately. Individuals should leave work and isolate from others until they receive negative results (see below if exposed).
 - If exposed to someone who tested positive (likely to hear from Public Health):
 - **FULLY VACCINATED** (>2 weeks after last recommended dose): Test if symptomatic and isolate until negative test result received. Otherwise, no quarantine required (exception is congregate living/high-density workplace). Monitor for symptoms for 14 days.
 - **NOT FULLY VACCINATED**: Quarantine and test at appropriate time (immediate if symptomatic; no earlier than day 5 if asymptomatic). Monitor for symptoms for 14 days.
 - **Surveillance testing**: recommended for unvaccinated individuals.

 - Kiosk Locations:

 - Deloney Bus Station (open from Monday through Friday 7AM - 3:30PM)
 - Walk-ins welcome or make your appointment on [curative.com](https://www.curative.com).
 - Print and post the [revised Curative Testing Flyer](#) to promote free COVID-19 testing for both locals and visitors. Reach out if you would like to request copies.
- **FREE VAULT SALIVA TESTS:**
 - Vault tests are still available to order for free for [individuals](#) and [businesses](#).
 - Also available to pick up outside the Teton County Health Department.

6) COVID-19 Vaccine Update:

- **Vaccine Appointments are OPEN for all individuals 12+**
 - Vaccine clinics are now held at the Teton County Health Department (460 East Pearl Ave).
 - Both Pfizer and the J&J Vaccines are available.
 - Individuals who are under 18 must have a parent or guardian sign their consent form and must be accompanied by someone over 18 years of age.
 - If you received a first dose of the Pfizer vaccine outside of Teton County and need a second dose, please bring your COVID Vaccine card and make sure that you received your first dose at least 17 days before you walk-in.
 - [Book an appointment](#) or walk-in any time *except for* the last 30 minutes of the day.
 - Clinics will be held:
 - Wednesdays from 3PM-7PM
 - Thursdays from 8:30AM-12:00 PM and 1:00PM-3:30PM
 - Fridays from 8:30AM- 12:00PM and 1:00PM-5:30PM
 - Saturdays from 8:30AM-12:30PM

 - Call our COVID hotline at 307-732-8628 option 1 between 9AM-4PM Monday-Friday to get assistance or you can email covidvax@tetoncountywy.gov if you have questions.
 - Community members can also book vaccine appointments at **Albertsons** and **Smith's Pharmacies**.
 - Both Pharmacies have the Moderna Vaccine and can accommodate both 1st and 2nd doses.
 - Smith's also carries J&J Vaccine – currently offering on Tuesdays and Wednesdays but is subject to change.

7) Guidance for Fully Vaccinated:

- According to the updated CDC guidance, individuals who are fully vaccinated can resume activities without wearing a mask or physical distancing except where masks or distancing are required by federal, state, local, tribal, or territorial laws, rules, regulations, and orders including local business and workplace policies. CDC made these updates due to continued evidence showing that fully vaccinated individuals are less likely to have an asymptomatic COVID-19 infection or transmit COVID-19 to others.
