

COVID-19 Updates and Resources – October 1, 2021

New Information:

1) Current Cases and Statistics:

- The Teton County COVID curve is currently flattening out, however we still remain in **RED (HIGH) RISK LEVEL**.
- For the last 7 days, Teton County new cases are 382.3 cases per 100,000 population.
- 5.2% of COVID-19 tests in the past two weeks were positive.
- Between September 13, 2021 and September 27, 2021 Teton County detected 232 new resident cases out of a total 278 reported cases. This is *no change* from the previous two-week period.
- In these last two weeks, there are continued notable case numbers amongst school-aged children. There are 71 reported COVID cases in 5-18 year-olds in the last two weeks.
- 43.2% of cases in the past two weeks have been due to community spread.
- As of 9/29/2021, there were 103 known active cases in Teton County.
- Data from the last 2 weeks report that the risk of getting COVID is ~4x higher in an unvaccinated person versus fully vaccinated individual. The proportion of breakthrough cases has decreased to 40% of the share of total cases. Currently, 50% of reported cases are among the unvaccinated. Teton County data shows that ~70% of reported cases hospitalized or in the ICU for COVID are unvaccinated. Vaccination remains vitally important to protect against severe illness and transmission due to COVID.
- Between 9/15-9/29, St. John's reported an average of 65.4% overall occupancy and ICU 71.3% occupancy. There has been an average of 5.6 PCU COVID+ patients and 2.0 ICU/Transfers COVID+ patient per day. Hospital occupancy remains high -- on 9/26 ICU was 100% full; the impact of COVID on healthcare capacity is still significant.

2) Updates on COVID-19 Vaccine:

- We will be transitioning the COVID vaccine clinic back to the **Presbyterian Church of Jackson Hole, beginning October 9**, in order to expand our capacities. Clinic hours will be mostly the same:
 - Wednesdays 10am-1:30pm; 2:30pm-7pm
 - Thursdays 8:30am-12pm; 1pm-3:30pm
 - Fridays 8:30am-12pm; 1pm-5:30pm
 - Saturdays 8:30am-12pm; 1pm-3:30pm
- Certain individuals can receive an [additional dose](#) of Moderna or Pfizer vaccine, and some individuals can receive a [booster dose of Pfizer vaccine](#).
- Other individuals who received Moderna or J&J vaccines do not need a booster shot and are not eligible for a Pfizer booster.

3) Flu Shots:

- Flu appointments are currently booked until October 14th.
- Beginning October 14th, we will begin to provide flu shots only, both regular and high dose vaccines at the **Teton County Health Department** with adjusted hours:
 - Thursdays 10am-7pm
 - Fridays 8:30am-5:30pm
- We will also be hosting a flu-a-palooza day on October 22: families are strongly encouraged and appointments are required.

Existing Information:

1) Resources for employees out of work due to COVID:

- Individuals who are out of work due to COVID can apply for unemployment by calling the Jackson Workforce Center (307) 733-4091. Please don't have them go in-person if they are currently on quarantine or isolation. Each unemployment application is evaluated as to whether they are eligible based on UI requirements.
- If someone contracts COVID-19 while at work, they can file a Workers Compensation Claim. They would need to go to the [Department of Workforce Services Website](#) and click on the Wyoming Report of Injury form and complete that.
- They cannot file for both unemployment and Workers Compensation.

2) Reminder:

- Close contact to a positive case is defined as 6 feet or less for 15 minutes or more, whether you are unmasked/masked and or inside/outside. (Exception is in K-12 schools where both students are masked). BUT by wearing a mask you are protecting yourself and neighbors from getting sick from COVID and reducing COVID-related hospitalizations and overburdening our healthcare system.

3) Teton County Face Covering Order:

- **Public Health Order #21-5** requiring individuals within Teton County, Wyoming to wear face coverings in certain places, with exceptions **has been extended through December 31, 2021.**
 - **Masks will be required when the County risk level is Red (high) or Orange (moderate).** If the risk level decreases to Yellow (low) or Green (new normal), masks will not be required. The community will be notified when the County's risk level moves to Yellow.

4) Contact Tracing Decision-Tree Flow Chart

- To help navigate an exposure in the workplace, please take a look at the [contact tracing flow chart](#). These documents are meant to be used as a guide to help you determine who is and who is not a close contact and action steps for those individuals.
 - All cases will be contacted. When we have a surge like we are experiencing right now, contacts may not be called but information will be made available to the case or the employer to share with the contacts.

5) COVID-19 Vaccine Info:

- Vaccines are available for all individuals 12 years and older.
- As of 8/13/21, additional doses for individuals with moderate/severe immunocompromised conditions are authorized by the FDA, CDC, and the WY Dept. of Health. TCHD began administering these on 8/18. [Visit our website](#) for the complete list of eligible individuals.
- On 8/23, the FDA fully approved the Pfizer vaccine (now called Comirnaty) for individuals 16+ years of age. Pfizer is still authorized for individuals 12-15 years and additional doses for individuals with moderate to severe immunocompromised conditions under Emergency Use Authorization.
- Walk-ins are currently **not accepted** so that we can most efficiently serve the increased demand for vaccines: [please make an appointment online](#).

 - Both Pharmacies have the Moderna Vaccine and can accommodate both 1st and 2nd doses
 - Smith's sometimes has J&J vaccine – check online or give them a call to confirm if you are interested.
- **5-11 YEAR OLDS:** Pfizer will soon have enough safety data from clinical trials to submit for EUA authorization to the FDA, which could potentially at the end of September. The FDA and ACIP then must respond within 3 weeks to the submission. This timeline is very tentative but could indicate authorization for this age group in mid to late October.
 - Current timeline for Moderna indicates closer to the end of the 2021 calendar year.

6) Testing Update and Resources:

- **WHEN TO TEST?**
 - **If you have symptoms (vaccinated or not) – test immediately. This includes cold-like symptoms!** Individuals should leave work and isolate from others until they receive negative results (see below if exposed).
 - If exposed to someone who tested positive (you are likely to hear from Public Health):
 - **FULLY VACCINATED** (>2 weeks after last recommended dose):
 - a. SYMPTOMATIC? Test immediately. Quarantine until results received. Isolate if positive.
 - b. NO SYMPTOMS? Test 3-5 days following a known exposure to someone with suspected or confirmed COVID-19. Wear a mask in all indoor settings for 14 days or until negative test result. Monitor for symptoms for 14 days. Isolate if test is positive.
 - **NOT FULLY VACCINATED:** Quarantine and test at appropriate time (immediately if symptomatic; no earlier than day 5 if asymptomatic). Monitor for symptoms for 14 days.
- **FREE CURATIVE TESTS:**
 - Curative has shifted tests to a **shallow nasal swab**.
 - Kiosk Locations:

- **FREE VAULT SALIVA TESTS:**
 - Vault tests are still available to order for free for [individuals](#) and [businesses](#).
 - Also available to pick up outside the Teton County Health Department in a cooler.
- **SURVEILLANCE TESTING:**
 - Surveillance testing is encouraged regardless of vaccine status, however it is especially important for those that are unvaccinated and those who work closely with travelers, vulnerable populations, and those who work in communal living environments.
 - Individuals *may* test if fully vaccinated. Being vaccinated will not affect your results.
 - We ask that if you are interested, please re-enroll by filling out the new [Business Surveillance Testing Sign-Up Form](#). We have sunsetted our previous list on July 1st.
 - You may fill out the form for each employee yourself or give to your employee directly.
