- I. **Call Meeting to Order** – Rich Ochs called the meeting to order at 8:30 A.M.

- III. **Approval of November Meeting Minutes** – Brian Coe made a motion to approve the November meeting minutes. Tom Ninnemann seconded the motion. All approved.
- IV. **Hazardous Materials Emergency Response Plan** – Rich Ochs – The plan was sent out before the meeting for everyone to review. No comments or concerns.
- V. **Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan Review** – Ryan Carroll with Michael Baker International in Denver is a consultant for the state who will review the mitigation plan. High level responsibilities were reviewed. A website and a public survey were created. Reviewed contacts, jurisdictions, roles & responsibilities. State is interested in getting all Region 8 plans updated. Want to close in on projects that are real and complete. FEMA is most concerned in the planning process itself. We will get this plan on the webpage and accessible to the public. Reviewed the schedule. The plan needs to be reviewed and approved by the state in September. Four phases of the project. Rich reviewed mitigation grants which are a 75%, 25% match. Discussed other entities that should be added as a signatory and their project plan. The current plan expires in 2021. Reviewed items that can improve the plan for next time. Reviewed the planning process. HIRA, mitigation strategy, plan review, evaluation etc. Survey seems to be the most effective way of collecting the community disaster concerns. FEMA wants to see the need mitigation project for each profiled hazard in each jurisdiction, a benefit cost analysis for each action,

identified funding source for each action and projects should be specific as possible. Will put the Power Point to the web page.

- VI. **Around the room** – Public Works will be on the streets next Friday getting ready for the sled dog race. Will review strategies for projects and update the mitigation plan. Public Health – VOAD put out a press release today with different organizations that can help people with the government shutdown. Rev Bott is working with Emergency Management and Public Health to plan transition to recovery. Teton Conservation District became a signatory and did software training for FEMA grants. It is a lot of work to apply for grants. Would like to see more organizations become signatories. Recognized all everyone in the room. Jackson Hole Fire/EMS is working on code adoption. Attended ASHER response with the school district last week. Will do an ASHER event with the village soon. Bob Culver will do emergency preparedness on an individual basis. Chief and Harland acknowledged everyone for their participation. Alyssa – Natalia Macker is Chair, Greg Epstein is Vice Chair, Luther Propst and Mark Barron are the newest commissioners. Red Cross is doing Shelter Fundamentals on February 22 and Saturday morning February 23 disaster assessment.
